Romans 6:1-14

1. Read Romans 5:12-21. How does Adam function as a type (foreshadow) of Christ? Explain what Paul means in 5:15 when he demonstrates how grace comes through Jesus. How does 5:20 impact the hope and joy of every believer? What danger is there in taking an extreme view of this truth?

2. Read Romans 6:1-10. What are the implications of a Christian's baptism according to Paul here? What does it mean that a Christian is dead to sin? How does that relate to every Christian's ongoing struggle with sin? How does being "set free from sin" (Romans 6:7) impact our struggle with sin?

3. Read Romans 6:11. How do Christians "consider themselves dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus?"

4. Read Romans 6:12-14. Spend some time in prayer, asking God to help you discern areas in your life that you continually present to sin. Ask Him for the grace and strength to help you leave those things behind and instead to present yourself to God as His instrument for righteousness.
