### To Go

1. Take a moment to list all of the ways you see the world in turmoil right now. To what do you attribute the turmoil? Discuss some potential solutions to whatever you see.
2. Read Ephesians 6:10–12. What does Paul say the church is struggling against? Why is it important to know who the real enemy is?
3. Read Ephesians 6:13–17. What does Paul tell us are six resources for combating our enemy? Discuss the significance of each resource and why it is integral for doing battle?
4. Read Ephesians 6:18–20. How is prayer a factor in this battle? What can we expect when we undergird our experience in prayer?
5. Read Ephesians 6:21–24. How does Paul's close to his letter indicate his convictions about what is possible for the church today?
6. Review Ephesians 2:8–10. Consider all that you've learned through our study in Ephesians. Write down a summary sentence that includes at least one indicative (that which God has done) and one imperative (that which God requires of you) that summarizes how you expect to walk and to stand in Christ. Then, ask God for the grace to do so.
