

1. Recall a time in your life when you experienced buyer's remorse. What motivated you to buy the product? How did it disappoint you once you had it?
2. Read Matthew 6:19–24. What does Jesus teach we are to do with our treasures? What are some examples of treasures that are vulnerable to moths, rust, and thievery? How about treasures that are immune from those things?
3. How does where we invest our treasure influence our hearts (v21)? Why is this so?
4. Why does Jesus make the statements he does in vv22–23? How do they enhance his argument? In what ways do we have control over the health of our eyes?
5. Why does Jesus make such a bold statement in v24? What about money (or mammon) makes it impossible to be enslaved to it and to God at the same time?
6. In what ways are you storing up treasures in heaven? How about the antithesis? How can you shift your investments to things that last? Ask God for courage to, as Jim Elliot once said, "give up what you cannot keep to gain that which you cannot lose."
