

- 1. Have you ever made a decision that you later regretted? Describe the circumstances. How would you have thought differently if you could go back and "re-decide"?
- 2. Read Genesis 1:1 and challenge yourself. How many theological truths can you discern from this short verse? Read Genesis 1:31. What does this tell us about how God felt about his creation? Why is that important?
- 3. Read Genesis 1:26–27 and Genesis 2:7. What do these verses tell us about our design? How is our design fixed and why is it such an affront to God when we try to operate outside of it?
- 4. Read Genesis 3:1–7. What were the key facets of Adam and Eve's failure? How are we prone to participate with them in that failure?
- 5. Scan through Genesis 3:8–11:26. How does God tend to respond to sin? How does God tend to respond to those who walk with him? Where can you find evidence of grace in these passages?
- 6. Read Genesis 11:27–12:3. How do the first 11 chapters of the Bible build towards this section of Scripture? Why is Abraham important? What does his showing up on the scene tell us about God's plan to redeem the Cosmos from its misery?
- 7. Read Genesis 5:24, 6:9, and 15:6. How do each of these individuals demonstrate faith? What are one or two practical ways you can join them in walking by faith today?
