- 1. As you're comfortable, describe one of your "road to nowhere" experiences. How did your broken heart color your perspective?
- Read Luke 24:13–25. How are these two disciples affected by what they've just witnessed? Why do they seem to have such trouble putting things together? Why might they not have seen Jesus clearly when he came alongside them?
- 3. Read Psalm 34. How does this Psalm reflect God's purpose when we think we're on the road to nowhere? How does Jesus in Luke 24 start to reshape the perspective of the disciples? Read Luke 24:26–30 for clues.
- 4. Read Luke 24:31–35. What changes for the disciples once they let Jesus in? How does Jesus re-color their perspective about what's happened? How does this restore their sense of mission?
- 5. Read 1 Corinthians 15:14. Why does Paul make this claim? Why is the resurrection the key to changing from being on the road to nowhere to being on the road to glory?
- 6. Have you put your faith in Jesus yet? If not, take a moment to do that. Talk to him and tell him that you believe in what the Bible teaches about him. Tell him you also believe what the Bible teaches about you (that you, like everyone, are lost in sin). But then, tell him that you believe Jesus died for your sin and rose again to establish his authority to do so. Then, invite him to be your Lord and Savior.
- 7. Consider your next step. If you know you're now on the road to glory, what would Jesus have you do? Come back to church more regularly? Join a growth group where you can be helped to know Jesus better? Re-establish a broken relationship? Ask God to reveal to you what it looks like for you, now, in light of Jesus' resurrection, to walk on the road to glory!
