1. Describe a time when someone has come along at just the right time to encourage you. What did they say or do that was most helpful?
2. Read John 14:1–3. On what basis does Jesus exhort the disciples to not be troubled? What does he promise to do for them?
3. Read John 14:4–6. What question does Thomas have for Jesus? How does Jesus answer? What piece of critical information do the disciples have in front of them to have confidence in where Jesus is leading them?
4. Read John 14:7–9. What request does Philip make of Jesus? How does Jesus respond? What should Philip already have realized before making this request?
5. Read John 14:10. On what basis should Philip already have understood who Jesus was?
6. Read John 14:11–12. How do Jesus' works confirm his authority? What greater works does he have in mind for his disciples?
7. Read John 14:13–14. What access does Jesus give the disciples that will help them continue to trust him even in the midst of great trouble? What does it mean to ask in Jesus' name?
8. How is Jesus inviting you to pursue peace in Him? Read the entire passage one more time (John 14:1–14) and invite Jesus to help you trust his words and his works for whatever struggle you have today.
