TO GO

- 1. Have you ever encountered someone who claimed to believe one thing, but their actions demonstrated something entirely different? How did the lack of congruence contribute to their message?
- 2. Read James 2:14–16. What example does James give to demonstrate the futility of faith without works? Can you think of how this sometimes happens in our world today? Why is it so easy [and tempting] in our current culture to fake philanthropy?
- 3. Read James 2:17–19. What additional example does James supply? How do demons demonstrate the disconnect between faith limited to doctrine alone and the more authentic faith that James is championing?
- 4. Read James 2:20–25. How do James and Paul use the term "justified" differently (James 2:24 and Romans 3:28)? In the end, how do their arguments compliment each other? Why is this such an important distinction to make, especially in our culture here in Central Wisconsin?
- 5. Read James 2:26. If faith without works is dead, then what are the implications for your life? Take a few moments to examine yourself, and to ask the Lord to reveal any incongruencies between your faith and your works. You might use Psalm 139 as a guide to your prayers.
